### Multiple Choice

In Municipal Court the standard of proof for the prosecutor to prove your guilt is:

- A. A preponderance of the evidence (more likely than not that the facts against you are as alleged)
- B. Clear and convincing evidence (highly probable or probably certain that what is alleged against you occurred)
- C. Beyond a reasonable doubt just like it was a felony case



### **Your Rights in Municipal Court**

### Right to trial

- · You have the same due process rights as those charged with a misdemeanor or felony.
- You are innocent until proven guilty beyond a reasonable doubt.
- You have the right to testify or remain silent.
- · You have the right to subpoena and cross-examine witnesses.
- If you are found not guilty, the case ends.
- If you are found guilty, you can accept the decision or appeal the case to the circuit court for a trial de novo.
- You MUST engage with the Court to resolve of your case.

### **Your Rights in Municipal Court** Right to know when



the court is open and attend court and access court records


- Hours: 8 a.m. to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday excluding holidays
- Court docket times: 9, 10 and 11 a.m. and 1:30, 2:30 and 3:30 p.m.

### **Your Rights in Municipal Court**

### Right to release pending hearing

You have a right to be released on your promise to appear unless the judge finds:



· Your release poses a danger to the community

If the judge decides either, then you may have to post bond.

## **Your Rights in Municipal Court**

### Right to an attorney


- You can hire an attorney, but it's not required
- You may represent yourself


### Right to have judge decide if you can afford an attorney or pay fines


- You can ask judge to decide if you
- qualify for a court-appointed attorney. You can ask the judge to decide if you are able to pay court fines or be granted an alternative sentence.







